K-12 education foundations go mostly unnoticed, yet the impact they have is clear.

A single parent knows the name of the scholarship program that will send her oldest to college – the first in her family; but she doesn't know it's the education foundation that raised the money for the scholarship and operates the program.

Parents encouraging their child to study STEM, because it is the basis for top careers and will provide the child with opportunities to do better than them, are unaware that the education foundation championed STEM and raised awareness of the issue.

Many teachers in low-income schools receive back-to-school kits and backpacks for their students; but they don't know the education foundation that provided the kits – and they don't know the education foundation may be an ongoing resource to their classrooms and schools.

For many school districts the education foundations are an untapped resource – even the nation's top education foundations in this study represent unrealized potential. Too many education leaders see their education foundations as the fundraising arm to the district. School districts should view K-12 education foundations as a top organizational asset that can be grown and leveraged to achieve the district's strategic goals.

A question to school superintendents and school board members: What would your school district look like if your education foundation doubled its growth and exponentially expanded its programs, grants, scholarships and other offerings? Better yet, what would your district look like without your education foundation?

Introduction to the 2014 Study and Rankings

This year’s Stepping Up study opened up the competition to education foundations in the 100 largest school districts by population, expanding from the previous study’s top 50 largest school districts in 2012. Widening the pool of districts led to a marked change in the top 25 landscape from 2012 rankings. Of note:

- Omaha is 98th largest school district but ranked third
- San Francisco is 72nd largest school district but ranked ninth
- Boston is 74th largest but ranked 11th
- Alpine is 51st largest but ranked 18th

Florida, Texas, Utah, Colorado, Tennessee and California are well represented among this year’s top 50.

Additionally, this year’s study separated foundations into four divisions based on annual revenues. “These divisions allowed for foundations of similar sizes to be compared and achievements recognized,” said Dewey Caruthers, president of d&a and the study’s author.

A top goal of Stepping Up is to improve the study each year. Methodology

To achieve the mission of the study – advocating the importance of K-12 education foundations while recognizing those that do it best – d&a prioritized revenues. “Annual revenues are the single most important determinant for the number of program offerings for students; the total amounts of grants and scholarships awarded to students and teachers, and the varieties of innovations created to enhance public education,” said Dewey Caruthers, president of dewey & associates and author of the study.

Because the study expanded to include the 92 foundations in the top 100 largest school districts there was a need to separate foundations into four divisions based on comparable size in terms of revenues, according to Caruthers, noting some districts don’t have K-12 foundations. “Stepping Up is about much more than comparing a \$3 million a year foundation to a \$300,000 one,” Caruthers said.

In addition to the overall national rankings, the four revenue-based divisions are as follows:

- Division 1: \$2 million or more (23 foundations)
- Division 2: \$1 million to \$1,999,999 (20 foundations)
- Division 3: \$500,000 to \$999,999 (15 foundations)
- Division 4: Less than \$500,000 (34 foundations)

d&a used eight performance categories – the same used in the 2012 Stepping Up study -- to rank the foundations in each division. The eight performance categories address four of the most important issues to K-12 foundations:

- Resources to enhance public education (annual revenues, revenues per student)
- Long-term financial sustainability (total assets, assets per student, investment income)
- Resources invested into programs (total grants and program expenses and grants and program expenses per student – both less salaries and benefits)
- Human capital (volunteers)

Per student calculations are added to better reveal the impact a foundation is having based on the number of students in the district. “Some foundations raise large amounts of money but when compared to the number of students in their districts it becomes clear the impact on most students is minimal,” Caruthers said.

The rankings are the collective score of all eight performance categories. The foundations that

appear in the most categories were ranked highest, emphasizing the importance of being well-rounded.

Data for the Stepping Up study is from the foundation’s 990, which is a financial report non-profits use annually to report to the U.S. Internal Revenue Service. The 2014 Stepping Up study uses the most recent 990 data available for all foundations included in this study, which is from 2012.

“The rankings recognize that foundations generating the most resources have the most impact on students and teachers in their districts,” Caruthers said. “This study is evidence that smaller school districts are homes to some of the nation’s top performing K-12 education foundations.”

Comparisons to the 2012 Stepping Up Study

Three of the top five foundations in the nation in 2012 also made the top five in 2014: Pinellas Education Foundation (FL), Denver Public Schools Foundation (CO), and Clark County Public Education Foundation (NV).

The Fund for Public Schools (NY) and the Hillsborough Education Foundation (FL) remained in the top 10 in 2014; while newcomers Omaha Public Schools Foundation (NE), The Foundation for Osceola Education (FL), San Francisco Education Fund, and The Foundation for Seminole County Public Schools (FL) joined the nation's top 10.

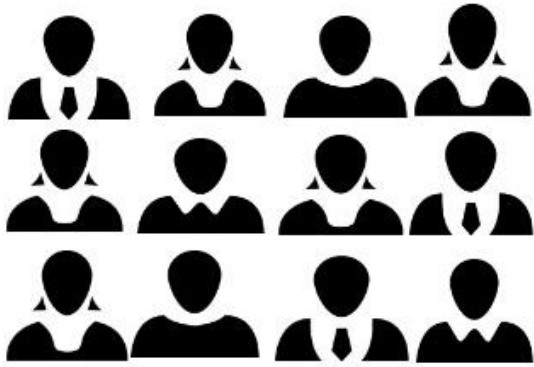


National Models for K-12 Education Foundations
